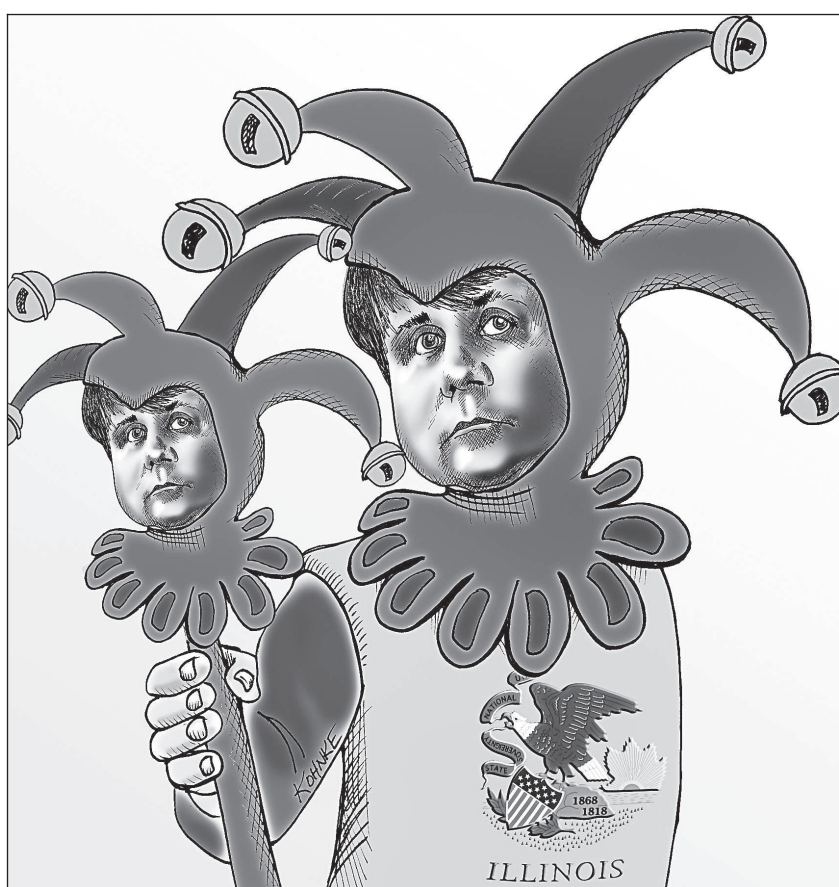
7. Have you ever gambled at casinos in Aruba with Chicago politicians? Did they win lots of money?
